Tips

Users are encouraged to access eChart 2022 using a web browser for workflows that require searching multiple patient records in a single session (e.g., confirming PHIN effective and expiry dates). This will enable efficient navigation between patient records. When reviewing medications in Category View, users may find it helpful to ungroup medications, displaying the most recent medications by date.
